Project description, including proposed use of NHNHB data:

- 1) A screening layer indicating buffered NHDOT roadway segments that require review. The screening layer buffer is generally 60' in each direction from the roadway centerline, though there are certain wildlife species that require an extended review buffer.
- 2) For plant species and exemplary natural communities/exemplary natural community systems: a shapefile including precise mapped location, element name, listing status, occurrence mapping precision, and year last observed for records within the screening layer buffer. Species considered "sensitive" by NHB are identified only to taxonomic group.
- 3) For animal species: a shapefile including precise mapped location, element name, listing status; occurrence mapping precision and year last observed for records within the screening layer buffer. Species considered "sensitive" by NHFG are identified only to taxonomic group.
- 4) For Northern Long-Eared Bats 2 shapefiles indicating buffered roadway segments that are within 1) 0.5 mile and 2) 0.25 mile of hibernacula or roost tree records.

Only projects that meet the following criteria can be reviewed using the NHB-provided GIS Screening Layer:

- · All construction and staging activities are either located within 15 feet of the edge of pavement, located only on paved or gravel surfaces, or in mowed areas.
- All work is within the existing State right-of-way
- Neither a wetlands permit nor a notification is required
- Only drainage work that is in-kind/replacement with no wetland permitting is included in project
- Coverage under the CGP is not required
- There is no change in footprint of the pavement

The cost of the license under this agreement (based on fees described in section b, including processing time, and current available NHDOT Roads shapefile & NHB database) is \$3089.50. A discount of 50% is available to state agencies, which would reduce the cost to \$1544.75.

The following NH Natural Heritage Bureau (NHNHB) data will be provided to the recipients, subject to the following Terms and Conditions, The NH Fish & Game (NHFG) Non-Game and Endangered Species Program has authority over animal species.

The recipient agrees to abide by the terms specified below:

1. The data provided in this release will be available only to the following named users:

NHDOT Bureau of Environment Staff

All of these data are CONFIDENTIAL - FOR INTERNAL USE ONLY.

The provided digital data will **not** be copied, distributed, or made accessible in any form **to other parties**. By signing this agreement, the user affirms the ability to maintain the data in a secure environment. Any requests to the recipient by other parties for these data will be referred directly to NHNHB.

- 2. Temporary in-house copies of the data (e.g. to a flash drive or e-mail attachment) must be limited to the users named in term 1 above. They must be deleted from temporary storage locations as soon as the transfer is completed.
- 3. Any products derived from the data provided in this release (e.g., publications, reports or maps) that are made available to anyone other than staff of the signatories to this agreement will **not** show, describe or otherwise depict the location of NHNHB element occurrences.

The mapped locations (GIS polygons) that NHNHB is providing under this Agreement shall not be made public. However, elements can be listed or mapped as 'present' in a defined area as long as that area is at least two square miles in size (e.g., town, HUC10 watershed, etc.).

- 4. The data provided in this release will not be modified in any way except as needed to make them compatible with the recipients' geographic information systems.
- 5. The recipient agrees to provide NHNHB with documentation of any rare species or exemplary natural communities found during the course of this Data Sharing Agreement, unless prohibited from doing so by other agreements. The recipient will use reporting forms as provided by NHNHB.
- 6. The digital data provided is to be used only for the purposes specified above. Access and use for other purposes, including by the named user, will be made only with prior expressed, written consent of the NHNHB and in accordance with **NH RSA 217-A**.
- 7. The recipients agree to delete all copies of NHNHB digital data provided under this Agreement on or before one year from the date the Agreement is fully signed.

The recipient also acknowledges that:

- a) This agreement takes effect and is valid for one year from the date of signature.
- b) NHNHB has data use license fees to help support the maintenance of the database. Rates for one year of access to the data are \$0.50 per record for "fuzzed" data (only approximate location provided). Best-available location data are \$10 per record for federally listed species with precise location, \$5 per record for federally listed species with general location, \$2 per record for state listed species with precise location, and \$0.50 per record for state listed species with general location. Processing time is charged at \$60/hour. NHNHB may apply a discount to non-profit and federal agency requests.
- c) Access to NHNHB digital data as described under this Agreement does not eliminate the need to consult with the US Fish & Wildlife Service and/or to submit an Environmental Review request through the NHNHB when state and federal permitting requires such documentation.
- d) Comprehensive surveys for rare species and exemplary natural communities have **not** been conducted for most of NH, and most NHNHB records have not been visited recently. On-site surveys are the only way to definitively determine whether rare species or exemplary natural communities are currently present at a site.
- e) The NHNHB data are continually being revised and expanded. The data provided in this release will, therefore, become outdated. Should a discrepancy develop between the data provided to the recipients and the data in the NHNHB databases, the data in the NHNHB databases are the correct data.
- f) Accurately interpreting NHNHB data requires a good understanding of Natural Heritage protocols. Users must read the metadata provided. For questions about various species and/or records provided, contact agencies as follows: For plants and natural communities, contact NHNHB. For state-listed animal species, contact NHFG. For federally listed species, contact local agencies first, then USFWS.
- g) Non-compliance with any provision of the agreement by any recipient may result in the immediate withdrawal of authority to use the digital data provided by NHNHB, and may result in the denial of all future data release requests by the recipient.
