


3. Historic Paving (1992-2024) NHDOT Miles of Road Resurfaced

Only possible with planned & sustained investments!





- Additional \$156M State Bridge Investment
- Bridges removed from State red list 138
- Predicted 118 remain at end of Draft TYP

Municipal Red List Bridge Summary

- 214 municipally owned, red-listed bridges.
- 43 already enrolled with the NHDOT for rehabilitation or replacement.
- 56 additional bridges recently enrolled with NHDOT for rehabilitation or replacement.

- Construction of Project




Project Public Involvement

 - Preferred Alternative Selected
 - Public Informational Meeting
 - Public Hearing (if acquiring property rights)



Capitol Corridor Project Summary

- Total Contract (FTA Funds) = \$5.4M
 - Completed core components of the study = \$4.6M
- Remaining funds = \$861K
 - Split between Nashua Transit and Manchester Transit Authority for FTA eligible activities
- Additional work is required to complete the New Start grant application = approx. \$861K
